
## <sup>A</sup> CHAMPION

It takes a team of champions to win the Super Bowl, but champions are not just athletes. They are salesmen, parents, teachers and philanthropists. Champions come in all shapes and sizes. Ben Roethlisberger, champion and athlete, lead his team to win Super Bowl XLIII, and now stands as a shining example for all other champions.

Not everyone can be a champion, but most of us have the capacity to do something exceptionally well. All of us here at United Financial have the potential to become champions in our own way, whether in our personal lives or on a professional level. The issue is: how to develop that potential? What are the qualities that translate the ordinary into the extraordinary? Personally, we think there are five major criteria that make a champion.

It means being prepared to take a chance when the opportunity presents itself, even if that risk fails.

The fourth and possibly the toughest quality of all is to **BE PREPARED TO FAIL**. A champion must be able to live with failure as well as enjoy success. The very act of courage carries with it the possibility of defeat. You must accept that risk, however calculated, may not pay off. Virtually no

Lastly, the fifth and final quality of a champion is to **BE MOTIVATED BY MORE THAN YOURSELF**. If the striving is purely selfish, something is missing; some aspect of championship that is elusive in definition but critical in action. Ben Roethlisberger is a champion because he excelled not on his own, but with and for his team. Only together could the team rise to the challenge of winning the Super Bowl.

The true champion is not just a winner. He or she is a person of compassion, motivated by a sense of obligation to others as strong as the will to succeed for themselves.

This is the first article in a three part series that will cover every destination scheduled for the trip. In it you'll learn all about what you don't want to miss while docked in port at Haiti.


Labadee is located on the north coast of Hispaniola, surrounded by beautiful mountain slopes and exotic foliage. This exclusive destination offers pristine beaches, breathtaking scenery and spectacular water activities. You'll find yourself surrounded by a beautiful landscape, filled with Labadee's native charm.

Whether you're interested in kayaking, snorkeling, parasailing or you just want to lie on the beach and relax, Labadee is a fantastic first destination. French and Creole are the official languages, but English is an accepted form of communication. U.S. Currency is accepted at the market-

place and everything else is charged to your shipboard account.

The Haitian Marketplace is where you'll be able to find native crafts. Filled with local shops, you can find anything from Haitian paintings to coffee and cognac. Be aware that all the prices are negotiable!





If shopping doesn't interest you, perhaps food will. Check out Labadee's Dragon Rock Cafe. A barbeque lunch is served at three different dining venues, with bars conveniently positioned throughout Labadee.

As far as leisure activities go, there are six beaches to choose from located

throughout Labadee, along with a Jet Ski marina offering rentals by the hour. You can also try kayaking, go parasailing, take a tour of a Haitian village, have fun snorkeling, or even go for a banana boat ride!

Keep in mind that Haiti is a tropical island with temperatures rising into the 80's during May, so remember to dress accordingly.


